Seeds, humble as they may be, are the catalysts for community building and resiliency, heritage and cultural preservation, and agricultural sustenance through regenerative practices and agroecology. LEARNING EXCHANGES

One of our partner farmers at Benguet Association of Seed Savers (BASS), Manong Macario, was invited to be a guest speaker at the Bukidnon Seed Steward Exchange hosted by our community partners at Salumayag Youth Collective for Foresters.

24 participants attended this collaborative learning exchange.

Participants exchanged knowledge and traditional methods in local seed production and seed saving practices.

PARTNERSHIP PROJECT

In December, our partner farmers at Benguet Association of Seed Savers (BASS) joined Sourcefit's annual year-end project, marking a significant collaboration for Global Seed Savers.

GSS facilitated a **1 million Pesos (\$17,000 plus USD)** contract for the Benguet Association of Seed Savers, to provide **3,000 bags of organic vegetables** to SourceFit a Philippine Outsourcing Company, to distribute to their partner communities in Metro Manila.

This project was made possible by the collective efforts of 24 local farms, involving over 50 farmers and farm workers, and 50 dedicated volunteers. BASS was able to deliver **8 tons of vegetables**.



POLICY FORUM



Our farmer-leaders from Benguet Association of Seed Savers (BASS) and Cebu Seed Savers (CSS) participated in a **weeklong policy formation workshop** with our partners at Good Food Community and the IBON Foundation.

Our Global Seed Savers Philippines Team and farmer leaders learned the ins and outs of local policy formation, advocacy, and planning. This experience highlighted the significance of engaging in policy discourse to advance our mission.

- **Local Seed Production Growth:** Expanding and building new local seed production sites to ensure that increased access to open-pollinated and indigenous seeds are widely available.
- **Participatory Seed Governance (PSG):** Working with strong local government partners to ensure open-pollinated and indigenous seeds are protected via strong local policy formation.

SEED GRANT

The Institute of Food Technologists (IFT) and Seeding The Future Foundation proudly announced the Seed Grant winners as well as finalists for Growth Grants and Grand Prizes for the third annual Seeding The Future Global Food System Challenge.

\$25,000

Seed Grants are awarded to 8 organizations, out of 900 submissions, that create innovative ideas to transform food systems and have developed a prototype or initial proof of concept demonstrating that their idea is feasible and highly impactful when scaled.


Seed Grant Winners and Finalists for Growth Grants and Grand Prizes Announced for Seeding The Future Global Food System Challenge


